

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Annamalai University

In the early 1920s, to serve the downtrodden and to promote Tamil Literature, Rajah Sir S.R.M. Annamalai Chettiar founded Sri Minakshi College and Sri Minakshi Tamil College at Chidambaram. In 1928, Rajah Sir S. R. M. Annamalai Chettiar agreed with the local Government to handover the above said institutions for establishing a University. Thus, on 01.01.1929 Annamalai University was established as per Annamalai University Act 1928 (Tamil Nadu Act 1 of 1929) amidst a rural environment serving all the disadvantaged districts of Tamil Nadu.

Annamalai University Act, 2013 (Tamil Nadu Act 20 of 2013), came into force from September 25, 2013, after obtaining the assent of His Excellency, the President of India. The Act of 2013 has been amended by enactment of Act No. 32 of 2021 to render the University as an affiliating University. Consequently the Colleges situated in the districts of Villupuram, Cuddalore, Kallakurichi and Mayiladuthurai have been affiliated to Annamalai University.

Accolades

Annamalai University, accredited with 'A+' Grade (3.38 CGPA) by NAAC in 2022, is one of India's largest public residential universities with 8 Faculties and 57 Departments/ Centres/ Divisions of study. Sprawling over 950 Acres of land, the University does yeoman service in taking education to the doorsteps of the people who are otherwise far from access to centres of higher learning. The University has initiated several innovative teaching programmes over the years that are progressive and human resource centric; Offering 'current-cum-next-gen' academic and research programmes that are global and national in character. 

I. Faculty of Agriculture

(Accredited by ICAR)

The Faculty of Agriculture was started in the year 1958. Presently there are nine Departments and one Division in this faculty namely, Agronomy, Entomology, Plant Pathology, Agricultural Microbiology, Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry, Genetics and Plant Breeding, Horticulture, Agricultural Economics, Agricultural Extension and Division of Animal Husbandry.

Quality and Excellence in Teaching

The Faculty offers facilities such as Hi-tech class room with LCD projectors and internet connectivity, well established Experimental farm, Agro-meteorological observatory, orchard, livestock farm and an air conditioned seminar hall.

Hands-on training in scientific agricultural and horticultural techniques and analytical skills are taught to students.

State-of-art knowledge in wider disciplines of agriculture are being imparted to the students to meet the global challenges.

Training programmes to take up commercial agriculture is integrated as a component of curriculum.



This fee will cover room rent, Electricity & Water charges, Establishment and miscellaneous charges only. The Mess fees of Rs.27,000/- will be adjusted from their Scholarship amount received from SC/ST Post Metric Scholarship and Higher Education Special Scholarship. If the Scholarship amount received is less than Rs.27,000/- the balance amount should be paid by the students.

3.3 Scholarships

The students of Annamalai University can avail of the Government Scholarships subject to eligibility.

I. First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession

In the G.O. (st) No 85 Higher Education (J2) Department dated: 16.04.2010, the Government of Tamil Nadu has ordered to grant tuition fee concession to the candidates who are to be the first graduate in a family. From the year 2013-14 onwards the tuition fee concession for First Graduate has also been extended to the students in Annamalai University.

For submitting proposals to the Government, for claiming First Graduate Tuition Fee concession, candidates should submit the following details:

Certificate obtained from Head Quarters Deputy Tahsildar in the format prescribed in the G.O. (Electronic form/Digitally Signed e-Certificate) which necessarily should include the names of applicant's father, mother, father's father, father's mother, mother's father, mother's mother, brother(s) and sister(s) and joint declaration by the applicant and parent/guardian in the prescribed format (Annexure-XIII).

If the applicant's Brother or Sister has availed First Graduate Tuition Fee Concession for studying Professional Courses, then the applicant is not eligible for such concession.

ii. Post Matric Scholarship: In the G.O. (st) No. 6 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 09.01.2012, G.O. (st) No.92 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 11.09.2012 and G.O. (st) No.16 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 24.02.2014, the Government has ordered to grant Post Matric Scholarship to SC/SCA/ST candidates, whose parental annual income is less than Rs. 2,50,000/- and for SC/SCA converted Christians whose parental annual income is less than Rs 2,00,000/- from all the sources. The eligible candidates have to submit income certificate obtained from appropriate authorities.

- **iii. Higher Education Special Scholarship:** Higher Education Special Scholarship is awarded to the hostel students belonging to SC / SCA / ST and Converted Christian categories. The Annual income from all sources should not exceed Rs 2,50,000/- per annum.
- **iv. BC/MBC/DNC Categories Scholarship:** The Students belonging to BC/MBC/DNC categories whose Parent's/Guardian's income from all sources is not more than Rs. 2,00,000/- per annum.
- v. An Equal Opportunity Cell and an SC/ST Cell is functioning in the University to assist the students in availing the Scholarships, besides carrying out various other activities for the benefit of the students. Students may approach these Cells for further details and assistance for Scholarship related matters.

IV. Eligibility Criteria

General

Candidates satisfying the eligibility conditions given below as on the last date of submission of application are eligible to apply. The candidates passing the qualifying examination after the last date of submission of application shall not be considered. Candidate should be a Citizen of India.

4.1 Nativity

- i. Tamil Nadu candidates who have passed VIII, IX, X, XI & XII Std. in Tamil Nadu, are eligible to apply. They need not enclose the "Nativity Certificate".
- ii. Tamil Nadu native candidates who have passed any of the VIII, IX, X, XI & XII Std. or their equivalent examination from schools situated outside Tamil Nadu can also apply. They should enclose a copy of the "Nativity Certificate".
- iii. Children of Central Government Employees may also apply for admission, irrespective of their native, provided their parents or guardians (only if both parents are not alive) have been serving in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past THREE YEARS at the time of submission of application which should be supported by enclosing a certificate from the employer of the parent or guardian, to that effect.
- iv. Sons and daughters of All India Service Tamil Nadu Cadre Officers are eligible to apply.
- v. Children of Employees in Public Sector or Government recognized Institutions who at the time of submission of application for admission employed in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past three years may also apply, irrespective of their domicile, provided a certificate from the employer is enclosed along with the application that the person is a Permanent Employee of the Firm or Institution concerned with evidence like Income Tax return, PF Slip, etc. and is working in Tamil Nadu continuously for the past THREE YEARS.
- vi. Other State candidates who have studied VIII, IX, X, XI & XII Std. in Tamil Nadu, are eligible to apply. They need not enclose the "Nativity Certificate".

Note:

- a) Applications without proper employer certificate for categories (iii) and (v) and nativity for the category (ii) will not be considered.
- b) Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservation. Others will be considered under "Open Competition".

4.2 Qualifying Examinations and Eligibility

A **Pass** in the Higher Secondary Course (HSC) Academic stream or Vocational stream or its equivalent qualifying examination with 10+2 years of schooling with minimum average percentage as given below will alone be eligible.

I) Higher Secondary Course (HSC) (Academic) / Equivalent Examination

Candidates who studied any one of the following groups are eligible.

Group I: Biology, Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

Group II: Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any one of the fourth (elective) subjects viz., Biotechnology, Microbiology, Biochemistry, Computer Science, Home Science, Agriculture, Horticulture, Informatics practices, and Environmental Science

Group II (A): Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology.

II) Higher Secondary Course (HSC) (Vocational) / Equivalent Examination

Five per cent of the seats are set apart for the candidates who qualified under Vocational Stream. Such candidates shall not be considered under the general merit list prepared for the candidates with Higher Secondary Course (HSC) (Academic) / Equivalent Examination.

- I. Candidates who passed Higher Secondary Course (HSC) under Vocational Stream and studied Biology and Agricultural Practices as vocational subject including theory and practicals are eligible for B.Sc.(Hons.) in Agriculture / B.Sc.(Hons.) in Horticulture.
- II. Candidates who passed Higher Secondary Course (HSC) under Vocational stream and studied Biology, Agricultural Science Theory, Agricultural Science Practical and Computer Technology as vocational subjects are eligible to apply for the degrees, viz., B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture and B.Sc. (Hons.) Horticulture,.
- III. Candidates who passed Higher Secondary Course (HSC) under Vocational stream and studied Biology, Agricultural Science Theory, Agricultural Science Practical and Employability Skills as vocational subjects are eligible to apply for the degrees, viz., B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture and B.Sc. (Hons.) Horticulture.

4.4. Age Limit

4.6 PG DIPLOMA IN LANDSCAPING AND ORNAMENTAL GARDENING (Regular Mode)

About the Programme

The **Post Graduate Diploma in Landscaping and Ornamental Gardening** is designed to equip students with advanced knowledge and practical skills in the field of landscape design, ornamental plant cultivation, and garden management. The programme aims to:

- Develop expertise in landscape planning, garden design, and maintenance.
- Train students in the scientific cultivation and management of ornamental plants, including trees, shrubs, climbers, and ground covers.
- Promote awareness and application of eco-friendly and sustainable gardening practices.
- Provide hands-on experience through field visits, practical training, and design projects.
- Prepare students for employment in landscaping firms, botanical gardens, public parks, real estate projects, educational institutions, and selfemployment ventures.

Eligibility

• A Bachelor's Degree in Agriculture / Horticulture / Forestry / Botany / Environmental Science / Home Science / Zoology or any other related discipline from a recognized university.

Candidates with relevant professional experience or a keen interest in landscaping and ornamental horticulture may also be considered, subject to approval by the admission committee.

Duration and Mode

- Duration: One Year (Two Semesters)
- Mode: Regular (Full-Time)

Classes will be held on campus with a balanced focus on theoretical instruction, practical sessions, and field exposure. The programme includes classroom lectures, garden design workshops, nursery visits, and landscaping projects.

Criteria for Selection

Admission will be based on the **marks obtained in the qualifying degree**, subject to eligibility criteria and seat availability. A merit list will be prepared, and candidates will be informed through email or the university notice board.

4.7 CERTIFICATE PROGRAMMES

Programme Details

1. Duration

The program will consist of 40 contact hours.

2. Eligibility Criteria

Candidates who have passed the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examination or equivalent are eligible to apply.

3. Admission

- 1. The program will admit a maximum of 25 students per batch.
- 2. Admission will be granted based on first-come, first-served basis or as determined by the program authorities.

4. Fees

- 1. The program fee is ₹4,000 per student.
- 2. The fee is non-refundable and must be paid in full at the time of admission.

5. Curriculum and Assessment

- 1. The program will cover relevant topics in agriculture as determined by the faculty.
- 2. Assessment will be based on attendance, assignments, and examinations as specified by the program authorities.

6. Attendance

- 1. Students are expected to attend all classes and practical sessions.
- 2. A minimum attendance percentage may be required to be eligible for the certificate (e.g., 75%).

7. Certificate

- 1. Students who successfully complete the program and meet the attendance requirements will be awarded a certificate.
- 2. The certificate will be issued upon completion of the program.

8. Conduct and Discipline

- 1. Students are expected to maintain discipline and adhere to the rules and regulations of the faculty.
- 2. Any misconduct or indiscipline may result in disciplinary action, including expulsion from the program.

9. Other Terms

- 1. The program authorities reserve the right to modify the rules and regulations as necessary.
- 2. Any disputes or issues will be resolved according to the policies of the faculty.

By enrolling in the program, students agree to abide by these rules and regulations.

V. Allocation of Seats

5.1 SELECTION SHALL BE MADE UNDER SEVEN CATEGORIES, NAMELY OC, BC, BC (MUSLIM), MBC/DNC, SC, SCA AND ST, FOLLOWING THE RULES OF RESERVATION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF TAMIL NADU.

- * 5% of the total seats available are reserved for Industry Sponsorship Quota and 5% of the total seats available are reserved for Non-Resident Indian (NRI) quota for admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture and B.Sc. (Hons.) Horticulture programmes as super numeracy admissions.
- * 5% of the total seats available are reserved for differently abled persons as per norms laid down by the Government.
- **5.2 a)** Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservations. The community recorded in the certificate of Tamil Nadu native candidate should figure in the list of communities approved by the Government of Tamil Nadu (Annexure-I).
- **5.2 b)** The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have obtained permanent community certificate (for SC/SCA/ST/MBC & DNC, BC and BC Muslim candidates) in permanent card format/ electronic form/ digitally signed e-

- **5.2 c)** Community Certificate obtained from **other states** will not be considered for communal reservation.
- **5.2 d)** For communities linked with Districts the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective districts except the communities mentioned in the G.O. (st) No. 95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dt: 28.10.2009. Such of those community certificates obtained on or after 28.10.2009 will be considered. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered.
- 5.2 e) Candidates who have not furnished a photocopy of the Permanent Community Card Certificate/ electronic form/ digitally signed e-Certificate at the time of submission of the application will be treated as belonging to "Open Competition" (OC).

The candidate is further informed that in the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions & rules prescribed for OC will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of OC, their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained.

- 5.2 f) ST / SC / SCA / MBC & DNC / BC / BCM (BC Muslim) candidates are eligible for selection under Open Competition in addition to the reservation made for them.
- 5.2 g) State Government School Quota

Seven and a half percent (7.5%) of seats on a "preferential basis" are reserved for students from State government schools in admission to all undergraduate courses both in constituent and affiliated colleges of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University. These students (academic and vocational stream) should have continuously studied from Class 6 to 12 in the State Government Schools of Tamil Nadu. Candidates who seek admission under this quota should furnish

his/her EMIS number at the time of filling online application. The eligibility for admission under this quota will be verified by the Government of Tamil Nadu based on the EMIS number. Admission will be awarded only to the Government of Tamil Nadu-approved eligible applicants. Therefore, TNAU will not hold responsibility for the mistakes made in the EMIS provided by the candidates at the time of application filling. The candidates who do not have an EMIS number should obtain and upload a bona fide certificate in the prescribed format provided.

5.2 h) Industry sponsorship and Non-Resident Indian (NRI) Quota

Candidates satisfying the minimum educational qualification prescribed and age limit can apply for either NRI or Industry Sponsorship quota. There will be a separate counseling for these quotas and seats will be allotted based on cut off mark merit basis among the eligible applicants under these categories and not on the communal reservations. The upper age limit is 21 years. The candidates should upload the necessary documents during online application submission process.

Industry Sponsorship Quota

Candidates of Indian Nationality alone are eligible to apply. Any public or private limited industry directly related to agricultural manufacturing or production related activities can sponsor one candidate once in four years by making an MOU with Faculty of Agriculture, Annamalai University for student internship or training or incubation. The industry willing to sponsor the candidate must be registered under companies Act and produce the following documents:

- 1. A letter expressing willingness to become a MOU partner with Faculty of Agriculture, Annamalai University for student internship or training or incubation.
- 2. Photocopy of sales Tax Registration certificate (GST).
- 3. Authorized signatory attested photocopy of PAN card along with Director Identification number of the sponsoring company.
- 4. Self-attested photo copy of PAN card and Director Identification Number of the authorized signatory.
- 5. Company auditor attested photocopy of Audited Balance Sheet for the last three years attested by company auditor. Proof for company auditor is to be attached.
- 6. Photocopy of Income Tax returns statement for the last three years attested by the company auditor or Authorized signatory. If accounts not been completed for the latest finical year, proof for advance or self-assessment tax paid and letter from auditor stating the status of accounting for that financial year should be submitted.
- 7. Photocopy of certificate of Incorporation.
- 8. Photocopy of Article of Association and memorandum of Association. Proof for authorized signatory or change of Director if any is to be produced wherever necessary.
- 9. Sponsorship letter Scanned copies of the originals must be uploaded at the time of online application process. The originals must be produced at the time of verification which will be initiated later through registered mobile or email.

Scanned copies of the originals must be uploaded at the time of online application process. The originals must be produced at the time of verification which will be intimated later through registered mobile /email. A committee formed by University will visit the sponsoring industry for verifying its genuineness and the expenditure incurred towards the visit of the committee. Rs. 25,000/- in the form of Demand Draft drawn in favour of "The Registrar, Annamalai University" must be borne by the sponsoring industry. This sum must be paid at the time of submitting the document as bound copy.

At the time of admission, the industry should enter into an MOU with Annamalai University by signing an agreement in Rs.100/- non-judicial stamp paper and remit a sponsorship fee of Rs.8.00 lakhs (Rupees Eight lakhs only) in the form of single Demand Draft drawn in favour of "The Registrar, Annamalai University". The DD shall be taken after the date of provisional selection. MOU signing will be done only after the selection in counselling and verification of necessary documents. MOU should be signed IN PERSON by the authorized signatory of the industry. Upon admission, the candidate has to pay the semester fee as per the course fee applicable for B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture.

Non-Resident Indian (NRI) Quota

The candidate can be a Non-resident Indian or Ward of a NRI or close direct relative of a Non-Resident Indian (NRI). The semester fee for students joining under NRI Quota is U.S Dollar (\$) 3000 per semester. The following documents should be furnished for seeking admission under NRI quota.

- 1. A letter sponsoring* the candidate for admission to UG program.
- 2. Attested copy of Passport with Visa details of the sponsor.
- 3. Proof for NRI to be obtained from Indian Embassy of the respective country Note: Resident card / Green card / Permanent Resident card / Residence proof / Employment certificate / OCI are not accepted as proof of NRI.
- 4. Proof of Relationship to the Candidate issued in the form of Notarized affidavit. The Notary should give the particulars of entry made in the register maintained by him.

*If the sponsor returns to India before the completion of Academic Period (four years) he / she must remit the entire balance amount in one lump sum.

VI. Special Reservation 6.1 SPECIAL CATEGORIES

Candidates are instructed to enclose appropriate form(s) / certificates as mentioned in Annexure-II or whichever applicable. If appropriate certificates or supporting documents for special reservation claim are not enclosed, their claim under such categories will not be considered.

ONLY TAMIL NADU NATIVE CANDIDATES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR SPECIAL RESERVATION.

QUOTA FOR SPECIAL CATEGORIES

Five percent of the seats are reserved for differently abled candidates in the UG degree programs offered. The differently abled candidates with only lower limb disability (locomotor disability) with a disability percentage for lower limb (locomotor disability) ranging from 40% to 60% shall alone be considered eligible. Candidates with less than 40% disability shall only be considered under their respective communal category. Though a differently abled applicant has lower limb disability (locomotor disability) with the admissible range of 40-60% if the disability-associated factors (with or without any other disability) that affect the applicant's study and increase the life risk to the candidate, his/her application shall not be considered for admission.

This condition shall be verified by a medical team at the time of application scrutiny. Applicants should fulfill all the other qualifying requirements. However, the maximum age limit is relaxed to 26 years (as of 1st July 2024). Candidates seeking admission against this reservation set apart for orthopedically differently abled (lower limb disability - disability percentage range: 40-60%) should produce the certificate issued by the district medical board concerned certifying the nature and extent of disability in percentage. Certificates obtained from an individual doctor will not be considered. Further, a separate TNAU medical team will examine the candidates concerning their certificates and his/her suitability for admission to UG and PG programmes. Candidates must produce a signed application form along with ANNEXURE II (generated on submission of online application) and medical certificate on a stipulated date and time.

It was published that persons with only locomotor disability (lower limb) are eligible to apply to TNAU and Annamalai University (pages 22 and 23 of the information brochure hosted in https://tnagfi.ucanapply.com). Based on the guidelines of the Government of Tamil Nadu, now it has been revised that applicants with locomotor disability, low vison, hearing impairment, cerebral palsy, and specific learning disability are considered eligible to apply to TNAU and AU. At the time of certificate verification and counselling, the eligibility for admission will be decided by the medical team based on functional requirements. Otherwise, all the eligibility requirements and relaxation for the differently-abled applicants laid in the brochure hold good.

VII. Mode of Selection

7.1 Selection of Candidates for Online Counselling to B.Sc.(Hons.) in Agriculture / B.Sc.(Hons.) in Horticulture.

The candidates have to fill in their choice of degree program and college at the time of online application filling based on which admission will be allotted. Online counseling selection process for general reservation candidates is done only through online counseling.

- During online counseling, the candidates will be allotted the degree and college, based on their rank, community, and choice preferences made by them at the time of application filling, as per the procedure given in the website http://tnagfi.ucanapply.com.
- An online counseling system will be followed for all degree programs.
- After the release of the rank list, candidates shortlisted will be informed through sms and e-mail. The ratio of 'number of vacant seats (seats to be filled)': 'number of candidates shortlisted for counseling' will be normally 1:5. Calling for online counseling does not guarantee a seat.
- Shortlisted candidates must pay a non-refundable counseling fee of Rs.3000/- (Rs. 1500/- for SC / SCA / ST categories) through their login credentials (http://tnagfi.ucanapply.com). Those who fail to pay the counseling fee will not be considered for online counseling.
- During online counseling, the candidate is permitted to change the order of preference for degree and college only once (as many times as he/she wants but the final submitted options will alone be considered for further processing). An sms and e-mail will be sent to the candidates in this regard (repeat in the next para). No modification is possible in subsequent counseling/ upward movement sessions. If no modification is done, in the choice of college and degree program, the preferences exercised while applying the online application will be considered for seat allotment.
- On the expiry of the online counseling date of the respective phase, the degree and college allotment will be done based on the final choice exercised and submitted by the candidate, merit, and communal reservations. The allotment will be informed to the candidates through sms and e-mail. The detailed instructions on admission fee payment, downloading of the allotment letter, and documents required for verification and submission will be informed through registered email.

- The candidates who registered (counseling fee paid) for online counseling and did not get any seat allotment in the first round of counseling, will be considered for allotting a seat during the subsequent upward movement process if a vacancy arises.
- After the online counseling, candidates will be called for certificate verification and submission before the stipulated time as specified by the chairman (admissions) to confirm their seats allotted to them.
- Before appearing for certificate verification at TNAU, Coimbatore, the candidates are required to pay an amount of Rs. 20,000/- towards the admission fee by online mode. Only on successful payment of admission fee, the allotment letter can be downloaded. This amount will be adjusted in their first-semester fee. Paying the admission fee does not guarantee the confirmation of a seat. Confirmation will be done only after the verification of certificates/documents and their submission before the stipulated time. A provisional admission card will be issued after successful verification.
- The admission fee (Rs.20,000/-) is refundable if the candidate has not registered the first semester of the degree program. And is non-refundable if a candidate withdraws his/her already secured admission under the government quota and is willing to get an admission under the management quota in an affiliated college.
- If any information (marks and qualification, community, date of birth, nativity, etc.,) is found incorrect, the candidature will summarily be rejected. If the candidate is willing to secure an admission further, he/she will be called for a re-counseling based on his/her revised credentials. Delay or absence for submission of certificates/documents and payment of fees will result in cancellation of the secured seat.
- Separate in-person counseling will be conducted at TNAU Coimbatore for special reservations (differently abled, NRI, and industrial sponsorship quotas) and general counseling based on necessity
- Candidates of Tamil Nadu nativity, who have applied for any one of the special reservations, are also eligible for general counseling.

Upward Movement System

- When a vacancy arises, based on the choice exercised and willingness expressed for upward movement, at the time of document verification, candidates will be moved to their best preferred upward choice of degree and college based on merit and communal reservation.
- An upward movement system will be followed for all counseling based on vacancy.
- Once opted for upward movement either it cannot be stopped in between or withdrawn.

Offline counseling

• Offline counseling will be conducted for special reservations (differently abled), NRI, and Industrial Sponsorship Quota.

- Offline counseling for differently abled will be conducted ahead of general counseling. Counseling for NRI and Industrial sponsorship Quota will be conducted after one or two phases of general counseling.
- Candidates attending special reservation counseling have to bring the necessary original document/certificate pertaining to their special reservation. If valid/original documents are not produced by the candidates during the counseling, they will not be allowed to attend the counseling process.

Offline Counseling Process

Candidates can choose the degree and college, based on their rank during offline counseling. Attendance of candidates will be marked both at the entry and exit. Candidates have to opt for a degree and college available at the time of counseling. DEGREE AND COLLEGE CHOICE ONCE MADE IS FINAL AND CANNOT BE CHANGED. Upward movement options will be obtained from the candidate. Candidates who have attended counseling and did not select any choice will be not considered for future counseling phases in the academic year. CALLING FOR COUNSELING DOES NOT GUARANTEE A SEAT. TA and DA will not be given for attending counseling.

Note: THERE IS NO WAIT LIST OPTION IN THE COUNSELING PROCESS

Candidates who fail to attend the counseling at the specified date and time will forfeit their right to admission. However, due to unforeseen and unavoidable reasons, if a candidate is unable to attend the counseling on the specified date and time, the candidate can authorize their parent/guardian on their behalf and the parent's /guardian's decision will be binding and final. Such authorization letter should bear photographs of the candidate and authorized person (candidate's parent/guardian) and be signed by both the candidate and authorized person. The authorized person attending the counseling on behalf of the candidate should carry the counseling letter and photocopy of the id proof. On-demand, the authorized person has to produce the id proof in original for verification. The format for the authorization letter is provided in ANNEXURE-XI.

7.2 RANKING PROCEDURE

Mark in each of the four main subjects would be converted to 50 as follows,

and the aggregate of the four subjects would be taken for ranking for maximum of 200 marks.

7.3 NORMALISATION OF MARKS AND INTER-SE MERIT

In the case of qualifying examination other than Tamil Nadu Higher Secondary (HSC) Examination, normalization procedure as ordered in the Tamil Nadu Admission in Professional Educational Institutions Act, 2006 (Tamil Nadu Act 3 of 2007), G.O. M.S. 190 Agriculture (AP.6) Department dt. 16.05.2007 and G.O.M.S.191 Agriculture (AP.6) Department dt. 16.5.2007 shall be adopted for computing minimum eligibility and ranking.

Illustration: If the highest mark secured by the student of State Board of Tamil Nadu in Physics is 100 and the highest marks secured by a student of any other Board in the same subject is 90 both the highest marks will be considered to be equal to 100. If a student of the other Board secures 60 marks in Physics when the first mark in Physics in the same Board is 90, 60 marks will be considered to be equal to 66.66 marks as arrived below.

- i. After normalisation of marks in the relevant subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by different Boards, the qualified students shall be merged into a common merit list.
- ii. In the case of candidates who have qualified from **National Boards** such as CBSE, ISCE etc. the highest mark obtained in the relevant subject by the candidates at the National Level alone will be taken into consideration for normalization.
- iii. The Other Boards will be requested to furnish the maximum marks scored in the relevant subjects. In case, such marks are not available before the preparation of rank, the maximum marks scored in that Board will be considered as 100%.
- iv. For minimum eligibility, normalized marks will be considered.
- v. A merit list will be prepared based on the total marks of 200. In cases where more than one student has got the same aggregate marks in the general rank list, the inter se merit among such students shall be determined in the order of priority as specified below (G.O. (Ms.) No.191 (AP.6) Department dated 16.05.2007):
 - 1. Marks out of 50 in Mathematics. If a student has not studied Mathematics, marks out of 50 in Biology or (Botany + Zoology)
 - 2. Marks out of 50 in Physics
 - 3. Marks out of 50 in Chemistry
 - 4. Date of Birth Eldest first
 - 5. Random Number (higher value will be given preference).

The overall rank and community wise rank lists will be published on the website of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University https://tnagfi.ucanapply.com No separate announcement will be made in the Newspapers.

7.4 ADMISSION TO SPECIAL RESERVATION CATEGORIES

Candidates who are applying for the special reservation categories of seats should satisfy the rules stipulated for admission. Allocation of these Special Reservation seats will be followed as per horizontal reservation.

If vacancy arises it will be reverted to the general online counselling in the respective communities.

VIII. CODE OF CONDUCT

The following code of conduct shall be observed by the students who are admitted.

- i. The students should conduct themselves in an exemplary manner so as to be model for other students.
- ii. All students will have to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of the University.
- iii. RAGGING: The candidates should not indulge or participate in any kind of ragging. If they are found to have indulged in ragging in the past, or noticed later, the candidates will be removed from the roll of the institution at whatever stage of study and criminal action will be taken against the candidates.
- iv. If any student is involved in ragging or any other anti-social activities, he/she will be expelled and criminal proceedings will be initiated against him/her.
- v. The students should be present during all working days and sincerely apply themselves to studies.
- vi. The students should attend the classes regularly and punctually and should fulfil the attendance requirement of 75% as prescribed by the University, to be eligible to appear for the University Examinations.
- vii. The campus is "Tobacco Free" and "Liquor Free". Any violation of this will result in dismissal from the programme.
- viii. Use of mobile phones and other electronic gadgets are not permitted in the class rooms, examination halls, faculty premises, university organized functions/programs/extracurricular and co-curricular activities.
- ix. The students are forbidden from using motorized vehicles, including powered two wheelers, inside the campus.
- x. Dress Code: Students need to wear formal dress largely covering them like Sarees/Churidhar with dupatta for ladies and Trousers, Pant & Shirt for men.

- v. Request for extension of time for submission of documents called for, after the specified date and time will not be entertained.
- vi. Any supporting documents received after the due date or application without required documents/particulars will not be entertained.
- vii. Photocopy/Fax copy of the application will not be accepted.

9.3 IMPORTANT CONDITIONS FOR APPLICANTS

- ii. Tuition fee for the entire programme together with arrears, if any, shall be payable by the student before Transfer Certificate is issued.
- iii. Special fee for the remaining period of programme shall be waived.
- iv. No certificate will be issued, unless the candidate has cleared all the arrears of fees etc., due to the Annamalai University.
- v. Caution deposit shall be refunded on application after adjustment towards any dues from the student. Application for refund of caution deposit should be submitted within one year of completing the course.
- vi. With regard to any dispute arising in relation to admission, examinations, remittance of fees, etc., the place of jurisdiction for the purpose of filing a suit or preferring a complaint or taking any legal proceedings against Annamalai University, will be Chidambaram Town only.

9.4 GENERAL INFORMATION

The following procedures should be followed for applying/getting certificates viz. Bonafide/Course completion/Mark lists etc. with the fee prescribed by the University.

- i. **General**: Mark list for each Semester/Year during the period of study will be issued by the University and distributed through the respective departments of study. On completion of the programme, Provisional Certificate and Transfer Certificate will also be distributed through the department concerned.
- ii. **Migration Certificate**: This certificate will be issued by the University Office ('Admission' Section) only on demand to those who have planned to undergo higher studies in any Educational Institution in India.
- iii. **Duplicate Certificate** Mark List / Degree / Transfer Certificate: A certificate from the police department is required to be produced for the loss of certificates indicating that the certificates were actually lost beyond recovery.
- iv. **Degree Certificate**: Notification will be issued in the leading dailies during the month of September/October every year inviting application forms for obtaining Degree Certificate at the Convocation. Students shall apply for the same in the prescribed form which can be obtained from the University.
- v. **Personal File**: Students are advised to maintain a personal file containing all academic records such as challan for remittance of tuition fee, exam fee, instrument fee, condonation fee etc. till completion of his/her studies.
- vi. **Re-admission**: In case of attendance deficiency during the tenure of his/her studies, candidates shall apply for re-admission through the Heads concerned

- along with the photocopy of his/her previous semester/year mark list(s) as proof for having appeared for the University Examinations.
- vii. **Change of Name/Date of Birth:** Candidate who wish to change of Name, date of Birth, of his/her name should be made only during the period of study by producing a copy of "Gazette Notification" from the respective Government No such change shall be entertained after completion for his/her studies in the University.

viii. How to get Certificate:

- a. Students may apply for any certificates in this University viz., Duplicate mark list, Degree Certificate, Transfer Certificate etc., either during the tenure of his/her studies on completion of the programme and may obtain the same from the office or by post within a fortnight period from the date of filing online application in the office. He/she should possess compulsorily 1) a copy of letter where he/she has applied for 2) a copy of remittance challan and 3) any other documents, whenever any lapse of the original submitted to University (or) loss in transaction.
- b. If candidates do not receive the certificate(s) within the stipulated period, then he/she can immediately seek the assistance of the Section Head/Deputy Registrar of the 'Admission' Section with relevant copy of records that has been already submitted for claiming the certificates, so as to enable them to get the certificate from the office (or) necessary guidance will be provided for the same.
- c. Students admitted to various programmes of the University, should get back his/her original certificates produced at the time of admission within three months either on completion of programme (or) discontinuing the same in the middle of the programme. The University is not responsible for any lapse or damage of the certificates, beyond this period.








DEPARTMENT OF GENETICS AND PLANT BREEDING


SOCIAL AND SCIENTIFIC CONTRIBUTION OF THE DEPARTMENT


