ANTI-RAGGING AWARENESS PROGRAM DURING ANTI-RAGGING

AWARENESS WEEK

(12th AUGUST 2025-18th AUGUST 2025)

In accordance with the directives of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and to promote a safe and welcoming campus environment, the Anti-Ragging Awareness Week was observed from 12th August 2025 to 18th August 2025. The week-long programme aimed to sensitize students, faculty, and staff about the adverse effects of ragging and the legal consequences associated with it.

Objectives:

- To educate students about the forms of ragging and its consequences.
- To foster a culture of respect, equality, and discipline among students.
- To provide guidance on reporting incidents of ragging and seeking support.
- To promote a ragging-free and safe campus environment.

Activities Conducted:

The Anti-Ragging Awareness Week included a variety of events and interactive sessions conducted across various faculties of the university as follows:

1. FACULTY OF ARTS:

On August 14, 2025, a number of competitions were held as part of the Anti-Ragging Week. The events were created to raise awareness about the significance of creating a welcoming and safe

2. FACULTY OF SCIENCE:

Various competitions and activities were organized across departments to encourage active participation and awareness among students.

I. ESSAY WRITING

Theme: Respect, Safety & Student Dignity

Date & Venue: 12th August 2025, Department of Chemistry

Details: The competition witnessed the participation of more than 40 students. The essays focused on the psychological, social, and legal impacts of ragging, while also suggesting constructive measures to ensure a safe and inclusive campus environment.

II. SLOGAN WRITING

Theme: Say No to Ragging — Build Respect

Date & Venue: 13th August 2025, Department of Biochemistry & Biotechnology

Details: With over 50 participants, the event encouraged students to create short, impactful, and memorable slogans. These slogans effectively reinforced anti-ragging messages and promoted mutual respect among peers.

III. POSTER PRESENTATION

Theme: Campus Safety & Peer Support

Date & Venue: 14th August 2025, Department of Computer & Information Science

Details: A total of 35 students participated in the poster presentation. Through creative visuals, participants highlighted the importance of a ragging-free environment, the role of peer support, and the need for proper reporting mechanisms to address issues.

The observance of **Anti-Ragging Awareness Week** successfully fostered awareness among students about the ill effects of ragging and strengthened the collective resolve to create a safe and respectful learning atmosphere within the Faculty of Science.

3. FACULTY OF MARINE SCIENCES:

As part of the University's **Anti-Ragging Awareness Week (12th–18th August 2025)**, the Centre of Advanced Study (CAS) in Marine Biology organized an **Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme** on **12th August 2025**. The event brought together faculty members, student volunteers, and guests with the aim of promoting a ragging-free campus environment.

Themes:

- "Ragging is an Evil"
- "Say Yes to Respect, Say No to Ragging"
- "Unity Against Ragging."

Objective: The programme aimed to sensitize students to the harmful effects of ragging, foster a culture of respect and empathy, and encourage student-led initiatives for prevention and reporting. **Details:** A series of competitions was held to actively engage students in spreading awareness. The events included Slogan Writing, Essay Writing, Speech (Tamil & English), Poster Making, Drawing, and Quiz. The events took place in the **Auditorium and Library** from **11:45 a.m. onwards**. Entries were evaluated based on relevance, creativity, clarity, and impact.

Highlights of Individual Events

- **Speech Competition (Tamil & English):** Students from the second to the final year delivered powerful speeches highlighting respect, unity, and the need to eliminate ragging. The session promoted student participation and peer-to-peer dialogue.
- **Slogan Writing, Essay, Drawing & Poster Making:** Conducted in the Library, these competitions brought out creative expressions emphasizing harmony, legal awareness, and the vision of a ragging-free campus.
- Quiz Competition: Designed to test students' knowledge of anti-ragging laws, institutional guidelines, and reporting mechanisms, encouraging awareness through an interactive format.

4. FACULTY OF ENGINEERING AND TECHNOLOGY:

As part of the University's Anti-Ragging Awareness Campaign, the **Faculty of Engineering** organized a series of competitions in August 2025.

I. ELOCUTION (TAMIL/ENGLISH)

Theme: Unmasking Ragging: A call for Change

Details: The event was held on 14.07.2025 at 03.00 p.m. Students were invited to deliver 3 to 5-minute speeches based on the given theme. Entries were evaluated based on the content accuracy, clarity and originality.

II. ESSAY WRITING (TAMIL/ENGLISH)

Theme: Ragging: A Menace to Society

Details: The event was held on 15.07.2025 at 03.00 pm, and the students were asked to write based on the theme of about 1000 words. The essays were judged based on originality, relevance, evidence and clarity. A total of 6 members participated in Tamil essay writing, and 7 in English essay writing.

III. SLOGAN WRITING

Theme: Ragging: Destroys Lives, Not Just Self-esteem.

Details: A total of 7 students participated in a slogan writing contest on the theme "*Ragging: Destroys Lives, Not Just Self-esteem*" conducted on 17.07.2025. Submissions were evaluated on brevity and effectiveness of the message.

IV. E-POSTER MAKING

Theme: Stop ragging, start respect, Impact of ragging on academic performance, A social evil that needs to be eradicated, Break the cycle of ragging

Details: Students designed e-posters on the themes "Stop Ragging, Start Respect" and "Break the Cycle of Ragging" in the competition held on 16.07.2025. Posters were judged on creativity, clarity of message, and visual impact. The best entries were showcased on digital platforms and campus displays to maximize visibility and reinforce the anti-ragging message.

V. DEBATE

Theme: "End the cycle of the fear"

Details: Teams debated for/against the theme "End the Cycle of Fear." Judging focused on argument strength, evidence, clarity, rebuttals, and decorum.

VI. RANGOLI COMPETITION

Theme:

1. "Hands Together Against Ragging", "Break the Chain of Ragging", "Respect Each Other, Reject Ragging"

Details: Faculty-level competition was held at **Kalaiarangam** on 13.08.2025. Around 20 teams (a team comprising 2 students) from various departments participated in the competition. The students showcased their exhibits colorfully, and finally, 8 teams out of 20 were selected. The winners of the

competition belong to Computer Science and Engineering, Civil Engineering, Civil and Structural Engineering and Information Technology.

5. FACULTY OF EDUCATION:

Competitions were organized for **B.Ed. I-Year and II-Year students** to creatively and critically express their stance against ragging.

EVENT DETAILS

- 1. **SLOGAN WRITING**: A total of 36 II-year and 26 I-year students participated, producing impactful slogans in English and Tamil.
- 2. **POSTER MAKING**: 23 II-year and 19 I-year students created posters that combined visuals and messages to condemn ragging.
- 3. **ESSAY WRITING**: 25 I-year students wrote essays that explored preventive measures, legal implications, and moral responsibilities.

All entries were evaluated by a jury panel, and prizes were awarded to the top three students in each competition.

On the same day, the Nodal Officer of the Anti-Ragging Cell, Dr.B.Manickavasagam delivered a special address, stressing the importance of preventing physical and psychological abuse and urging students to reject ragging and foster respectful peer relations.

6. DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY:

EVENTS CONDUCTED

I. ESSAY WRITING:

This competition provided a platform for participants to articulate their thoughts on anti-ragging issues.

II. SLOGAN CONTEST:

The event was designed to enhance communication skills and express anti-ragging messages effectively.

III. POSTER PRESENTATION:

Students were invited to design and present posters that depicted anti-ragging themes and messages. The best posters were chosen based on their creativity, message clarity, and overall impact.

7. <u>DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION:</u>

The Department of Physical Education (Sports Science) conducted its Anti-Ragging competitions as part of the university's **UGC** Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme held from 12–18 August 2025. 8. FACULTY OF FINE ARTS:

I. ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

This contest challenged students to create impactful slogans that could be used in the anti-ragging campaign. The goal was to generate short, memorable messages that could effectively raise awareness.

9. FACULTY OF AGRICULTURE:

The Faculty of Agriculture organized a series of events to raise awareness about the harmful effects of ragging and to encourage a respectful and safe campus environment. The activities engaged students creatively and intellectually, promoting empathy, critical thinking, and proactive anti-ragging advocacy.

I. POSTER MAKING

Objective: To raise visual awareness about the harmful effects of ragging and motivate students to foster a respectful campus environment.

Event Details: Students created posters conveying anti-ragging messages; entries were judged on creativity, clarity of theme, and visual impact. Winning posters were displayed across campus and on digital platforms to maximize outreach.

II. PHOTOGRAPHY

Objective: To capture and communicate powerful, real-world perspectives on empathy, safety, and the consequences of ragging.

Event Details: Participants submitted original photographs that illustrated anti-ragging themes; submissions were evaluated for composition, emotional impact, and relevance. Top photos were showcased in a campus gallery and online to spark dialogue.

III. SLOGAN WRITING

Objective: To encourage concise, memorable messaging that raises awareness and prompts action against ragging.

Event Details: Students submitted short slogans judged on originality, brevity, and effectiveness. The best slogans were displayed on notice boards and digital screens to reinforce reporting channels and prevention messages.

IV. ESSAY WRITING (TAMIL / ENGLISH)

Objective: To deepen understanding of ragging's impacts and generate thoughtful, student-led solutions in Tamil and English.

Event Details: Participants submitted 800–1000-word essays judged on relevance, clarity, evidence/examples, and language quality. The top essays received certificates and were published on campus platforms to inform policy and practice.

V. QUIZ COMPETITION

Objective: To test and strengthen students' knowledge of what constitutes ragging, legal provisions, and institutional reporting mechanisms.

Event Details: Teams competed in a timed quiz covering definitions, consequences, and reporting procedures; scoring prioritized accuracy and speed. Winners were awarded certificates and provided with quick-reference material on anti-ragging resources.

VI. DEBATE

Objective: To develop critical thinking and persuasive advocacy on measures to eliminate ragging and build safer campuses.

Event Details: Teams debated the motion with structured speeches and rebuttals; judging emphasized argument strength, use of evidence, clarity, and decorum. Key points and suggested actions were shared campus-wide after the event.






Report on Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme

Highlights of the Programme

Dr. B. Manickavasagam, in his Welcome Address, highlighted the importance of creating awareness among students about the ill effects of ragging. He stressed that ragging is not only punishable by law but also destroys the academic and personal lives of students.



In his Presidential Address, Dr. S. Arivudainambi emphasized that Annamalai University has adopted a policy of 'Zero Tolerance' towards ragging. He urged students to maintain discipline and harmony in the campus environment and reminded them that mutual respect is the foundation of academic growth.



Delivering the Special Address, Dr. M. Prakash stated that ragging is an uncivilized act that has no place in higher education. He called upon students to cultivate leadership qualities and uphold the dignity of the university.



In his Felicitation Address, Mr. K. Ambethkar, Inspector of Police, Annamalainagar, assured strict legal action against those who indulge in ragging. He highlighted the role of police in ensuring student safety both inside and outside the campus.



Mr. T.A.J. Lamech, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Chidambaram, also felicitated the event and encouraged students to channel their energies into positive activities rather than harmful practices like ragging.



The Keynote Address was delivered by Mr. S. Jeyakumar, I.P.S., Superintendent of Police, Cuddalore District. He spoke firmly about the consequences of ragging and shared real-life cases where students faced legal action, including imprisonment, for ragging-related offences. He emphasized that ragging ruins not only the lives of victims but also the future of offenders. He urged students to come forward and report incidents without fear, assuring them of full

protection.
